On November 12-14, the troop traveled to the Kettle Moraine State Forest in Wisconsin for a weekend of backpacking and camping. This was our second training hike for the Philmont crew. They spent two nights on the Ice Age Trail and hiked 15 miles while the other scouts camped at a regular campground and hiked over 6 miles and worked on rank advancements. The weather could have been better, but we all got to test our rain gear to see how well it works.

On December 11-12, we will be cabin camping at the Kendall County Outdoor Education Center (formerly known as Hoover Scout Ranch), in Yorkville, Ill. This trip will start Saturday morning and go until mid-day Sunday. The scouts will play board games and explore the woods near the cabin. Hopefully we will get some snow by then. Permission slips are due December 7.

On January 28, we will test our cold weather camping skills at the Indian Prairie District Klondike Derby at Green Valley Forest Preserve. If you have any questions, please let me know.
