SCOUTMASTER'S CORNER

Dear Troop 75:

“A scout is helpful” is one of the points in the Scout Law. What does being helpful mean? It means serving and caring about others and to not expect reward or payment. At home, it means you help your mom, dad and siblings around the house and doing chores. In Scouts, you can help people with service projects and volunteer hours. How can you be helpful at meetings and at outings? We'll have 20 new scouts who will need a lot of help. It is an opportunity to do a Good Turn for them. They will not understand how to do things in the troop like putting up tents, turning on stoves, finding things in the trailer and running a meeting. You have the opportunity to teach them these things plus the Scoutcraft skills that an older scout has taught you.

Here is a story that brings to life being helpful: Before Chicago publisher William D. Boyce made his fortune in the Windy City, he traveled the world. In 1909, Boyce was on his way home from an African safari and lost his way in a dense London fog. A Scout came to his aid and, after guiding Mr Boyce, refused a tip, explaining that he would not take a tip for doing a Good Turn. This gesture by an unknown Scout inspired a meeting with Robert Baden-Powell, the British founder of the Boy Scouts. As a result, William Boyce incorporated the Boy Scouts of America on February 8, 1910. Being helpful is what started the Boy Scouts of America. Who knows what your helpful act will inspire in one of our new scouts?

Adult Volunteers

Troop 75 runs with the support of adult volunteers. Adults do the business side of scouting so we can provide a better program for the scouts, and it allows the scouts to focus on the things that matter to create young men of character. We have volunteer opportunities in all parts of our adult leadership:

Adults also serve by going on campouts and serving on some of the larger Committee efforts like Pancake Breakfast or the Troop Picnic.
