

BSA High Adventure Programs Include:

Philmont Scout Ranch: Backpacking treks, horseback cavalcades and more in 14 square miles of rugged northern New Mexico wilderness.

Glacier NP/ Summit Bechtel Reserve: White water rafting, Rock climbing, rappelling (abseiling), mountain biking, hiking, geocaching, and orienteering within the New River Gorge National River area.

Boundary Waters Canoeing: High Adventure Canoe trips in Ely, Minnesota.

Sea Base Florida: Sailing, scuba diving, rustic camping on an undeveloped barrier island, fishing, and more off the coast of Florida.

Cost of Scouting

When scouts join Troop 75, we have a joining fee that covers chartering with Three Fires Council and the cost of patches and their Scout handbook.

Monthly campout costs range from \$25 to \$150 and summer camp is around \$300-\$350.

Scouts have an opportunity to earn money in their scout accounts through our annual fundraiser – the Troop 75 Pancake Breakfast on the first Sunday of December. This mandatory fundraiser helps the Troop pay for new equipment and some Troop operations, and scouts can earn money to pay for Troop campouts and Summer Camp.



We ask parents to help within the scouting program to provide a quality experience to the scouts by serving as Committee members, Scoutmasters, and/or merit badge counselors.

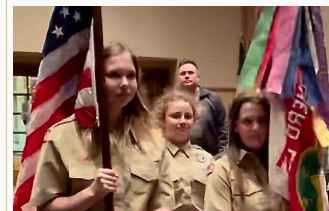

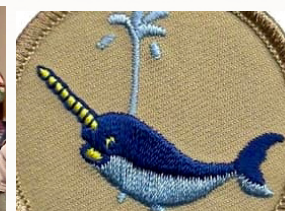
Newest Loon Scouts making their first campout meal

Our Narwhal Patrol Leading Flags for their first Court of Honor.



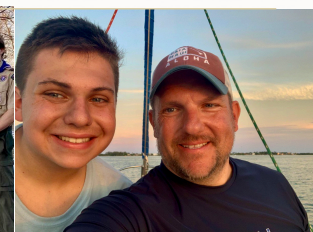
